CONCEPT NOTE

If Philosophy is the mother of all the subjects as opined by the scholars, the research can be considered as the basis of the enlightenment leading the humanity towards the path of intellectual growth and the materialistic development. Here one can quote Kant to have a deeper understanding of the term 'research' when he stated, 'Thoughts without content are empty; intuitions without concepts are blind". Vico, in his book, 'The New Science', through history, wanted to bring on a find blend of 'the values and abstractions of rationality, as well as the mixture of skepticism and belief characteristic of the Enlightenment'. Whereas Collingwood harped on causality as the key factor behind the social sciences, which it can be questioned from the perceptions of interpretations or hermeneutical point of view, focusing on the dichotomy of objectivity and subjectivity. On the other hand, the Indian system of learning is crucially depended on 1) epistemology, 2) ontology, and 3) axiology. Amongst these three, epistemology has been considered as the pillar of the Indian philosophy.

With this backdrop, it can be said that, a social science researcher has to know the nitty-gritty of anticipating knowledge which will help him/her to experience the essence of research on the basis of epistemology and ontology. Through this workshop the participants will be able to get an idea about the recent trends of research in social sciences and humanities focusing on the core of the qualitative methods aiming for research designing, hypothesis formation, data collection, survey methods, field study, content analysis, etc. with a notion of criticality. This Workshop will be also highlighting on the research issues related to Indic studies or Indology.
